- What things might distract you from showing hospitality to others?


Next Steps

Hospitality - philoxenos

<u>Love</u> (philo) + <u>Stranger</u> (xenos) = <u>Loving the Stranger</u>

Paul's Passion for Hospitality - Acts 9

1. An <u>Encounter</u> with God

"The Lord appeared to him from afar, saying, 'I have loved you with an everlasting love; therefore I have drawn you with lovingkindness." Jeremiah 31:3

2. God Draws to the Church
