### How to use Talk it Over:

Talking through the message during the week helps you and your family/friends turn what God is saying to you into action steps.

### Pastor Tim's Main Idea:

In order to close the proverbial back door, we need to be connecting as a church outside the worship service.

### **Key Questions:**

- What's one idea from the message that really stood out to you? Why did this idea grab your attention?
- What does the New Testament example of hospitality teach us about church?
- If the church is the people, where can God's people meet for church?
- How does discipleship happen when we invite someone to our home?
- What might prevent you from showing hospitality by inviting someone to your home?

## **Next Steps**

- In light of the way God uses to the church to reach others, what might God be calling you to in your life or at church?
- What would make you more effective in showing hospitality to both guests and members at church?
- The home is a key place for ministry, consider inviting people over for fun, lunch, or small groups.
